### LOCAL K-9 SEARCH & RESCUE GROUP TO BE HONORED \$2000 grant to be awarded Tuesday night.

In recognition of their outstanding search and rescue efforts, the Tennessee Special Response Team - A has been selected to receive a \$2000 grant from the American Kennel Club. The grant, part of the AKC's Companion Animal Recovery Support and Relief Fund, will be presented Tuesday evening during an award ceremony hosted by the Tennessee Valley Kennel Club.

The Special Response Team - A is a search and rescue team specializing in K-9 utilization. Members are nationally certified as search and rescue technicians, first responders, and amateur radio operators. The team's dogs and their handlers were called out a total of twenty-four (24) times during the past year to assist in locating missing persons. In addition to the search and rescue work, the Special Response Team also provides public education programs to help the general public better cope with natural and man-made disasters.
